

Fostering a connection between living and learning





THE 19th ANNUAL REPORT 2003

Our honourable Chief Guest, Ms. Lethika Saran, IPS, Additional Director of General Police, Chennai, respected Chairman, Mr. T.V. Alexander, General Manager, SIPO, Mrs. Alexander, members of the Managing Committee, distinguished guests, dear parents and fellow High Rangers. It is indeed a privilege to welcome Ms. Lethika Saran on this hallowed occasion. Thank you madam for taking time off from your hectic schedule to be with us here today, particularly when there are explosions going off all over the country. I am sure this visit will revive fond memories you have of this picturesque paradise. On behalf of the Chairman and the managing committee I extend a warm welcome to all of you.

Now before I actually begin to tell you about what is really happening in The High Range School, it is my pleasant duty to highlight the major achievements over the last year and I shall attempt to do so briefly.

On the academic front we have done extremely well. Our batch of '03 comprised 17 students in the All India Senior School Certificate Examinations out of which 5 finished with distinction and the remaining 12 with a first. Dalish Sequeira, Vishak S and Chitra M performed commendably with top scores of 85.6%, 83.4% and 81% respectively. In the All India Secondary School Examinations we sent up 24 students out of whom Meril B Paul topped with 92.2%, M. Muzhumathi with 86.2% and Emmanuel Sam Whitchurch with 86%. 10 of them came out with distinction, 13 with a first class and 1 with a second. Isn't that a heart-warming performance ladies and gentlemen? The credit for which goes to the excellent team of teachers we have here. Why I am saying this is because, one, we do not screen and allow only selected students to take the year prior to the exam, second, the children are not let off their daily hectic schedule during the year prior to the examinations. It might interest you to know that the preparations for the Annual Day have been done in the midst of monthly tests and regular classes.

On the sports field we have acquitted ourselves admirably. Our table tennis teams have been riding on the crest of a wave. Under the tutelage of Mr. Rajendran the boys' and the girls' teams have been on a winning streak. They were the over-all winners

at the All Kerala Inter School TT Championships conducted by YMCA Fort Kochi in November. In the Inter District and State TT Championships held in December 2002 at the Rajiv Gandhi Indoor Stadium Kochi we bagged the silver medal in the boys' event and the Gold Medal in the girls' event. In November 2002 we hosted the CBSE (Cluster 6-All Kerala Inter School) TT championships and our players stole the show by being the overall champions once again. In this context I would like to thank Mr. John Pereira, Executive, IR Department, whose assistance and moral support helped in the smooth conduct of this mega tournament. The next step was the teams' commendable participation in the CBSE National Inter School Championships at Delhi in Dec-Jan 2003. Recently the teams continued their spectacular performances when they hogged the lime light in the Idukki district Inter school Championships held at KDH club Munnar and the Inter School TT tournament conducted by the CBSE at Trivandrum. They emerged the over-all winners among 22 participating schools from Kerala. The following students deserve credit for their sterling performances. Nithya Devi, Sreeja S, Padma Soundarya, Shravani Shivshankar, Bindhya K, Saranya M, Nakul, Shaldrin Pereira, Saravanan, Akhil, Anoop Kumar, Siddarth Rajendran and Allan Gomez. Our shuttle badminton teams will be travelling to Vizag to participate in the CBSE South Zone Badminton Championships in November. Our soccer team will be playing in Perinthalmanna to take part in the CBSE Cluster VI-football tournament. The martial art has always fascinated the young since the days of Bruce Lee. I am proud to mention the fabulous achievement of Vipin of class XII who received the black belt, the first one awarded to a High Range student. Plans are afoot to initiate basketball to High Rangers.

In the fast changing educational scenario constant upgrading of teacher's training is of paramount importance. Mr. Arivarasu, our mathematics teacher attended a workshop on Boolean algebra conducted by the Kerala Maths Teachers Association at Bhavan's Vidya Mandir, Elammakara, Cochin. Mrs. Janaki Thiagarajan, Mrs. Annamma Mathew, Mrs. Sushamma Baby, Mrs. Sindhu Vinod and Mr. M.V. Narayanan of the

Science department attended a one-day science workshop at Sivagiri Public School, Alwaye. A five-day computer training programme conducted by Educomp (Intel group) helped teachers to hone their computer skills. Mrs. Flory Gomez and Mrs. Usha Rani visited the Kinder Garten section of Naval Public School, Kochi as a part of an exchange programme.

The philosophy that learning should be an integrated process and fun as well will soon become a reality at The High Range School. A Mathematics lab, a language laboratory, and technology driven classrooms will soon become functional in due course of time. The New Indian Express as a part of their NIE programme will be imparting a highly attractive package of personality development skills at school. The global response to the growing stress on children is to teach them life skills. The CBSE has designed a course in Life Skills Education, which will educate learners to resist consumerism, facilitating conflict management and developing appreciation of nature. I am happy to announce that we will be commencing this programme with immediate effect.

As parents you will be familiar with the tremendous range of co-curricular activities the school offers. Recently our quiz teams have participated in the CBSE heritage quiz and the famous ESPN sports quiz at Kochi. Next week 6 teams will be taking part in the Young World Quiz organised by the reputed national daily 'The Hindu' at Kochi. It is not surprising that our classy orators Asha Mary Kurien and Anjali G.S of class X stole the thunder by winning the Inter School debate conducted by Delta Study at Ernakulam. Our budding artists are all ready with their easels and paintbrushes to participate in the Young World drawing contest 2003. Scouting for boys and girls has seen a renewed sense of interest this year. The much-loved Duke of Edinburgh Award now christened as IAYP (International Award for Young People) is being pursued with great enthusiasm. You will presently witness our variety entertainment programme, which is a heady mix of the traditional and the modem. Our classical dances, skits, playlets, songs and the Senior English play are all a testimony of the year round exposure to all these vibrant activities.

The students of classes 6 and above had the rare privilege of visiting the Naval Base at Cochin. It was a learning experience in every sense as they got a first hand experience of the various nuances on board.

Thanks to our Chairman who personally took interest in making this highly educative trip possible. Soon High Rangers will be attending a sailing programme on board naval ships at Kochi. I am sure this will inspire many of our children to pursue a career in the Navy.

The Eco Club at school is highly active and befittingly commemorated World Environment Day. Ms. Meenakshi an eminent environmentalist from Kodaikanal was the chief guest. She also inaugurated the butterfly and herbal gardens in the school campus. Vipin Antony of class XII was adjudged the best Eco Club boy and Asha Mary Kurien the best Eco club girl. A word of special thanks to Mr. P. Guha Thakurta, Chairman HRW & EPA and Mr. James Zachariah, Wild Life Warden, Eravikulam for having interviewed the Eco Club members and making the selection. Our sincere gratitude to Mr. K.N. Chengappa for sponsoring the cash prize and the certificates.

The school would like to thank the invaluable assistance given to our children by Dr. B.K. Sudhindra, who counselled the senior children on 'Coping with Adolescence' and 'Sex education', and Dr. Mercy David for her sessions with the girls.

We bid farewell to Mr. H.L. Chopra, the former Principal, Mrs. & Mr. Sasi Krishnan, Mrs. Sindhu Vinod, Mr. A. Sambathrajan and Mrs. Sona Bennet. On behalf of the Chairman I would like to thank them for their dedicated services at school.

I would like to welcome Mrs. Amirthavalli, Mrs. Maya Vinod, Mrs. Sheila Kanavalli, Mr.T. Thavamani and Mr. Remanan.O.T to the teaching faculty. I wish them a long and fruitful stay at school.

This then is therefore a tale of our landmarks in the last year. Today I stand before you as the 9th Principal of this institution. I must confess that the decision to move here was a tough one. To be or not to be' was the Hamlet like dilemma! Within a couple of days, please permit me to use, a politician's cliche, I will be completing 50 days in office and believe me I have enjoyed every day of it. I admire your children's tenacity who commute long distances to come here. I relish their child-like chatter and of course their contagious enthusiasm. I must say they are a wonderful bunch of kids. During my first assembly I remember sharing with them Martin Luther King Jr"s. well-known speech 'I have a dream...' I would like to place on record my gratitude to the Chairman, the Managing Committee and the PTA for their unwavering support. A word of special thanks to Mr. K. Sreenivasan, Vice Principal and the dedicated team of faculty who continue to toil

untiringly to give their best to our children. The support staff which include the bus drivers, attendants and the ayahs need to be complimented for their sincere services. Let me assure you that your children are in very good hands. My report would be incomplete if I fail to thank the following departments at High Range. The Regional Office, the Workshop and Engineering Department and all the estates have at all times been a pillar of support to the school. I am ever grateful to the dedicated team of medical personnel from the General Hospital.

Ladies and Gentlemen I have taken enough of your time but may I seek you indulgence for another moment. 

A Field Trip to the High Range Dairy

We left the school at 10 a.m and reached Sengulam Dairy Society at 10.45 a.m on Thursday, 12th February.

We went by Letchmi bus and were escorted by our teachers Mrs. Janaki Thiagarajan and Mrs. Valsamma Nelson.

We were divided in to two batches. Mr. Venu Gopal explained to us how the milk is pasturised and filled in to packets.

Milk received in cans is tested by touch, smell and also for fat content, Weight is taken then filtered twice. In cream separaters cream is removed and the milk that goes for pasturisation process has 3% and 3.5% fat. Milk is heated to 72 to 80° c and suddenly passed to less than 5°c. We touched and felt the difference in temperatures in the pipes where heating and cooling was done. Then milk goes to

Homogeniser to make the fats and non fat solids even. Then automatically packed in to half litre polythene packs. Finally it is stored in the cold storage room.

cks. Finally it is stored in the cold storage room. They also make curd, butter milk, butter and ghee.

Then from there we went to Sengulam Dam site and had our lunch. We played near the water for sometime. We saw a water tank with beautiful purple lilies and more beautiful red lotuses. We also saw many different types of trees. We enjoyed ourselves thoroughly.

Then it was time to return back to school. We re-

turned by about 1.30 p.m.

Our science thanks to the Principal, Vice principal, our teachers, Chelladurai and Shakti annans because of whom we had such nice, interesting and informative field trip.

THE AIM AND PURPOSE OF EDUCATIO


"Education Springs out the images of the future".

REPORT OF THE WORKSHOP CONDUCTED FOR THE HIGH RANGE SCHOOL TEACHERS ON THE EFFECTIVE USE OF MULTIMEDIA IN CLASSROOM BY MRS. KR1SHNAMANISHAJI & MRS. PRIYA SINGH OF 'TEACHWELL CLUB', KOCHI.

We, the teachers of the High Range School, had the privilege to attend a very useful and informative workshop on "The Effective Use Of Multimedia In Classroom" in 2003-'04. The two eminent and inspiring resource persons from the 'Teachwell Club" who conducted the programme were Mrs. Krishanmani Shaji, a former English teacher of our own school and Mrs. Priya Singh. The whole programme was based on a package of Intel titled "Teach To The Future".

The first part of the programme was for 3 days in June 2003. It started with an introductory session by Mrs. Krishnamani Shaji in our staff room. We were grouped into pairs and given handouts of Intel. This consisted of a book with an interactive C.D. and sheets with details relevant to operation of computers for teaching, evaluation, planning of lessons, blue prints for question papers, projects etc. Then we were taken to the computer lab. Mrs. Krishanamani first explained to the beginners the basic parts and operations of a computer. We were then asked to select a topic each based on our subjects and classes. She explained the use of PowerPoint and its unlimited scope. She taught us to make presentations on PowerPoint with proper slides and apt clip arts. She also downloaded many

diagrams and flowcharts from the Internet and we had to paste them on the slides. We evaluated these presentations based on given guidelines. We used Excel for the preparation of mark lists and consolidation of reports.

The second session was by Mrs. Priya Singh during which she talked about the objectives of this programme and the activities of the "Teachwell Club" which has been training teachers of many schools and teacher trainees in our country. She gave us a demonstration on Microsoft Publisher, which is now used in bringing out school Newsletters and Magazines.

We had a third session again by Mrs. Krishnamani Shaji to clarify our doubts. We were then told to make one lesson plan each for a 35 minutes class and send it to her, which we promptly did in August 2003.

Inspired by the whole programme many of our teachers became members of the "Teachwell club".

We are extremely thankful to our Management, our Principal and Vice Principal for organizing this programme. We are also grateful to the two resource persons for all their help and guidance.





Our school is an institution situated at very high altitude in a hilly region. It is the best school in Idukki district. A school of joys, academics, sports, freedom etc.



शिवमंगल सिंह 'सुमन' का जन्म उत्तर प्रदेश में सन् १९१६ ई. में हुआ। इनकी प्रारंम्भिक शिक्षा गाँव के स्कूल में ही हुई। १९६१ में ये माधव कॉलेज, उज्जैन के प्राचार्य नियुक्त हुए तथा कुछ वर्षों बाद इन्होने विक्रम विश्वविद्यालय, उज्जैन में कुलपित के रूप में कार्यभार सँभाला। इसी पद से अवकाश लेकर अब ये साहित्य सेवा में रत है।

प्रगतिवादी काव्यधारा से जुड़े रहने पर भी 'सुमन' का रूमानी हृदय प्रेम और श्रृंगार के सुन्दर गीतों में खूब रहा है। उनकी दो प्रकार की रचनाएँ दिखाई पड़ती है - छोटी - छोटी सुगाठित कविताएँ इनके गीतों में प्रेम और प्रकृति की सरस व्यंजना है, जबिक लम्बी कविताओं में जन-जागरण का कोई-न-कोई ज्वलंत पक्ष है। इनकी छोटी कविताएँ और गीत अधिक व्यंग्यात्मक, सरस और चित्रात्मक है और लम्बी कविताएँ प्रायः वर्णनात्मक है।



हिल्लोल, जीवन के गान, प्रलय सृजन, मिट्टी की बारात, विध्य हिमालय, पर आँखें नहीं भरी तथा विश्वास बढ़ता ही गया सुमन जी की प्रसिध्द काव्य-कृतियाँ हैं।

रीति-काव्य के महान प्रतिभा

राम-काव्य के अन्तर्गत केशवदास का नाम भी उल्लेखनीय है। किन्तु केशवदास भक्त किव न थे। उनकी रचनाएँ भिक्त-साहित्य के साथ सम्बद्ध नहीं की जा सकती। राम-कथा का विषय लेकर उन्होनें साहित्यिक गौरव की दृष्टि से अपनी रचनाओं का निर्माण किया। उन्होंने जहाँ एक और 'रामचिन्द्रका' की रचना राम-काव्य के अन्तर्गत की, वहाँ दूसरी और रीतिकाव्य के अन्तर्गत 'जहाँगीर जसचिन्द्रका' और 'वीरिसंहदेव चिरत' की रचना की। इस प्रकार उन्होंने अपने पांडित्य द्वारा प्रत्येक प्रकार की काव्य धारा में योग दिया।

केशवदास का जन्म लगभग १५५५, संस्कृत साहित्य के

पांरगत विद्वानों के वंश में हुआ था। वे सनादय ब्राह्म्ण थे और प्रसिद्ध नाटक 'प्रतिबोधचन्द्रोदय' के रचियता श्रीकृष्णदत के पौत्र और 'शीघ्रबोध' के रचयीता काशीनाद के पुत्र थे। 'नखिसख' के रचयीता बलभद्र उनके बड़े भाई थे।

वे ओरछा-नरेश के आश्रय में रहते थे। वीर सिंहदेव चरित', 'जहाँगीर जसचंद्रिका', 'रतनवावनी' और विज्ञनगीता' के अतिरिक्त उनके प्रमुख ग्रंथ तीन है - 'रिसकप्रिया', 'रामचिन्द्रका' ही महत्वपूर्ण ग्रन्थ है। अतः यहाँ उसी पर विचार किया जायगा। यह महान प्रतिभा सन् १६२७ में मर गए।

राम-भिक्त का प्रचार रामानन्द और उनकी लम्बी शिष्य-परंपरा द्वारा तो हो ही रही हैं। किन्तु उसका पूर्ण विकास गोस्वामी तुलसीदास की रचनाओं के माध्यम द्वारा हुआ।

कवीर ने भी रामनाम का प्रयोग किया था, किन्तु सन्त-मत से रामनाम के रूप को एक विभिन्न ढ्रग्ड से स्थापित किया। राम-साहित्य के प्रधान किव तुलसीदास हैं, जो एक महान् लोकनायक धर्मात्मा थे। देशी-विदेशी सभी विद्वानों ने उनकी महत् स्वीकार की हैं। अभी तक दोहा-चौपाइयों में राम-कथा कहने वाले सर्वप्रथम किव तुलसीदास ही माना जाता है। किन्तु हाल की खोंजों से सातवी शताब्दी के चतुर्भुज स्वयंभू, कवि द्वारा रचित राम - कथाओं की सूचना प्राप्त हुई है।

तुलसी से पहले भगवत-दास और चन्द नामक दो कवियों के नाम मिलते हैं, जो तुलसी की काव्य-परंपरा से संबद्ध किए जा सकते हैं। कहा जाता है कि स्वयं तुलसी के समय में मुनिलाल कवि ने रीतिशास्त्र की प्रणाली के अनुसार 'रामप्रकाइ' ग्रंथ की रचना की जो रीति-परंपरा में गिना जाता है। किन्तु हिन्दु धर्म के वास्तविक स्वरूप, लोक-शिक्षा और आदर्श की कल्पना तुलसी ने ही की।

पाठ्य पुस्तक से परीक्षा की ओर

परीक्षाओं के लिए तैयारी की प्रक्रिया के रूप में स्वीकार करने के लिए में प्रतिदिन उपदेश दिया जाता है। ऐसा प्रतीम होता है कि शिक्षा के संदर्भ में अन्य किसी प्ररेणा अथवा प्रयोजन की वैधता नहीं वची है। इस प्रकार की मानासिकता पैदा करने के कार्य में शिक्षकों का योगदान विशेष रूप से विचारणीय है। शिक्षा के उद्देश्य के रूप में "बच्चे के समग्र व्यक्तित्व का विकास" देश में कहीं भी स्थित शिक्षक प्रशिक्षण संस्थानों में प्रतिदिन दोहराया जाता है। ऐसा प्रतीत होता है कि अत्यधिक वडी कक्षाएँ, भारी प्राठ्यक्रम, कठिन पुस्तके आदि के फलस्वरूप विकसित कठिन परिस्थितियों में शिक्षक यह अनुभव करते हैं कि वे इस प्रकार के उच्च उद्देश्यों के लिए ज्यादा कुछ नहीं कर सकते। इसके अतिरिक्त उनमें से अधिकांश के पास शिक्षा के उद्देश्यों को पूरा करने के लिए न तो ज्ञान ही होता है और न ही आवश्यक कुशलता।

वास्विवकता यह है कि सैध्दांतिक दृष्टि से पाठ्यक्रम तथा पाठ्यपुस्तको की तैयारी में शिक्षकों की सहभागिता सिद्धांत रूप में स्वीकार तो की जाती है परंतु व्यवहार में इस कार्य में मुट्ठीभर शिक्षक ही प्रतीकात्मक रूप से भाग लेते है। अतः अद्यिकाश शिक्षकों के पास इस प्रकार सोचने का आधार है कि उन्हें पाठ्यक्रम तथा पाठ्यपुस्तकों में समय-समय पर किए गए परिवर्तनों के विषय में कुछ कहने की आवश्यकता नहीं है।



शिक्षाक्रम सुधार के प्रति शिक्षको की जागरूकता तथा सहभागिता को बढ़ावा देने के लिए कोई स्थापित प्रक्रिया या अधिकारिक मंच नहीं है। इसके विपरीत कुछ ऐसे मामले भी सामने आए है जिनमें किसी शिक्षक ने शासन द्वारा प्रकाशित पाठ्यपुस्तक में किसी गलती के विषय में शिकायत की तो उलटा उन पर ही कार्यवाही हुई। यद्यपि इस प्रकार के मामल बहुत ही कम होते है और उन्हे अति दुर्भाग्यपूर्ण ही माना जाता है, परंतु इनसे इतना तो स्पष्ट होता है कि अधिकाश शिक्षक सहज रूप से ऐसा क्यों सोचते है कि जिन पाठयक्रमों को वे पढ़ाते है, उन्हें आलोचनात्मक ढगं से जाँचने का कार्य उनका नहीं है। बच्चो की प्राकृतिक प्रतिभा की पहचान करते हुए उनमें अवलोकन तथा खोजबीन के द्वारा सीखने की याग्यता का विकास करना प्रयोगशाला का मुख्य उद्देश्य होता है। प्रयोग्शाला की कल्पना "अन्वेषणशाला" के रूप में की जानी चाहिए तथा स्कूलों को बच्चो की जरूरतो के अनुकूल "प्रयोग" चुनने की स्वतंत्रता होनी चाहिए।

छ्यावादी-रहस्यवादी काव्य-परम्परा में यदि पन्त अपनी सौन्दर्य - भावना और सुकृमारता के लिए प्रसिध्द हैं, तो महादेवी को कविता में वेदना की प्रमुखता है। उनकी रचनाओं में व्यक्त वेदना लोकोत्तर स्तर तक पहुँच जाती है। समीप में रहकर भी उनकी सूक्ष्म उपार्थिक अनुभूतियों की अभिव्यक्ति की है, अलौक्कि वेदना प्रकट की ऐसा काव्य है। वेदना उनको प्यारा है।

'महादेवीं का रहस्यवाद - भावात्मक है, न कि साधनात्मक और यह प्रेम-परक दार्शनिक, भिक्त और प्रकृति-परक है। विश्व-प्रकृति में किसी अप्रत्यक्ष सत्ता का आभास पाती हैं और आत्मा परमात्मा और प्रकृति-परमात्मा की निरूपण करती है। महादेवी की रहस्यानुभूति में प्रेम की वेदना है, और वेदना का माध्यम प्रकृति है। युग की परिवर्तशीलता के प्रति भी महादेवी उदासीन नहीं रहीं। किन्तु उनका कहना है: 'वास्तव में हमने जीवन को उसके सिक्रय संवेदन के साथ स्वीकार न करके एक विशेष बौद्धिक दृष्टिकोण से छु भर दिया है। इसी से जैसे यथार्थ से साक्षात करने में असमर्थ छायावाद का भाव पक्ष में पलायन करने में असमर्थ प्रगतिवाद क चिन्तन में पलायन सहज है।

महादेवी के मुक्तक में निश्चित व्यक्तित्व है, वह मुख्यतः उद्गारात्मक है। उनमें माधुर्य भाव है और उसमें उनका हृदय संकलित है। वास्तव में महादेवी के गीतों में भाव, भाषा और संगीत की त्रिवेणी बहती हुई मिलती है। महादेवी ने उनके लाक्षणिक और सांकेतिक प्रयोंग प्रस्तुत किए है, यद्यपि उनमें से कुछ दुर्बोध भी है।
